First, imagine you're a writer. You just *love* writing! And therefore you write *all* kinds of stories: beautiful and ugly, funny and scary, happy and sad, those which unfold slowly over time and those that are packed with action on every page.

You love them all! For you, it's all about the creative process itself: the ideas that emerge in your mind out of the blue, the way they morph and inspire new ideas, the way they becomes words, scenes, chapters and volumes... It's pure **thrill!**

Or imagine you're a painter. You *love* painting in a way that you can't put into words. You're the happy owner of the world's most exquisite palette and it's got it all: Black and white. Day and night. And all the colors in between... To arrange them in endless shapes and forms, layer upon layer... It's pure **creative ecstasy!**

**Oh my God!** What a feeling, to play like this...

Yes, exactly! **This IS your God! This is how God the Creator experiences the process of creating all there is. God is in love with all creations, unconditionally and infinitely.**

Now imagine – or paint - that within one of those grand stories (or paintings or movies) of yours there is a character that goes through a terribly difficult challenge... What could it be?

In this story he is a mountain climber who is getting ready for the ultimate challenge of his life: Climbing the Everest. He's got all the equipment he needs. In fact, he's spent most of his savings on it and with no regrets. This is the dream of his life coming true. Climbing Mount Everest at last, after all these years of preparation... Wow!

He's enjoying his last day of relative luxury in a local hotel. Tomorrow he'll be heading for the base camp. He spends the day with a group of peers, sharing stories, hopes, fears and knowledge, talking and laughing. He walks outside for a moment, enjoys the thin, fresh air in his strong lungs. He's high with joy, expectation and excitement. He feels like sending a message to his girl-friend and reaches for the cell phone in his pocket.

Oh, there's a new message there, and it's from her. That's funny. He opens her message with a big smile on his face and reads: "You better enjoy the trip 'cause I won't be there when you come back."

Nothing more. No explanation. It feels like an explosion in the midst of the endless innocent white around him. He is burnt. He is shaken. He can't think. He needs something to drink. He goes back to the hotel lobby and orders a soda but realizes he has left his purse in his room.

He enters his room and it's almost empty. This can't be true! Most of his fancy, expensive equipment is gone. His personal belonging and purse too. Thieves, here? Impossible. This cannot be happening. Yet it is.

Without the equipment and without money his chances to climb the top are suddenly reduced to zero. He can't make it. No way. He can't go there. He can't go back either. He has no money. Even if he had, he has nothing and no one to go back to either.

He has lost everything and there's no way home.

This is the moment when the fear really gets to him. Fear, disappointment and rage. After all that he has sacrificed just to get here, this, now? Why? This is so unfair!

Don't you think so too? Haven't you been there too at some point in your life, one way or another? You know the feeling, don't you? I think you do.

But wait: **This is just a story!**

And a great one! Envision the breath-taking landscape around our hero, the mountains, the snow, the stillness out there, the sky, the cheerful faces around him, the changing emotions showing on his face, in his eyes, his hands, his voice... What a beautiful drama this is!

Not to him it isn't. To him it's pain and suffering, nothing more. At least for now.

**He believes he doesn't want this. He believes he prefers something else.**

He prefers the perfect trip, the perfect credit, the perfect girl friend.

"Often I'll find clues to where the story might go by figuring out where the characters would rather not go". Says writer Doug Lawson. He's got a point there.

**The character in the story believes he knows what he prefers but he's lying to himself. He's forgotten where the story comes from. He's got no idea where it goes. And, in the heat of the moment, he has no idea who he really is either.**

Yes, he is lying to himself big time. But then, that too is part of the story, part of the grand illusion. He *thinks* he'd like to write this story differently, but that's not the case. He is a character. **He has a role to play. He has a part in a drama created to give him wonderful creative experiences.**

Even if part of him would prefer something else, another part of him enjoys exactly what is. It's so exciting! How will the story continue? Will there be a happy end? Will he survive at all?

"But what about his hardships, his pain and his fear?" you may say. Is he supposed to suffer all that just for the sake of creating wonderful experiences? Just so that God can have a moment of creative fun? What kind of a God would do this to one of His creations anyway?

Ah... You believe all this is real, don't you? **You believe the pain is real, and the fear, and the anger, and the sadness, and the loneliness, and the poverty, and the death.** Of course you do. You're supposed to believe it, otherwise there would be no story, no experiences, no nothing.

Yet it is not real. It is a story. It is a divine dream. It is God's imagination.

All of it: our hero, the journey, the landscape, the money, the girl-friend, the pain, the losses, the wish to climb the mountain top and get home too - it is all taking place within God's imagination. Your imagination.

**There is nothing outside God. There is nothing but love, joyfulness, peace, wisdom, creativity, power. A loving God playing in Consciousness is the only reality there is.**

It may not make sense to you at this moment. Or maybe it does, intellectually and intuitively. You just can't quite feel that only Reality. Or maybe you do, in glimpses. But not all the time.

**Does it feel like a problem, not being able to feel God all the time?** It probably does. Only it's not so. There is no problem. That too is but part of a divine story.

**So? What now? Knowing what you know now, where do you go from here?**

It's difficult to tell. After all, you don't know where you go with your own story. **You can't look into your future. Everything's possible!** But basically there are two directions to go, [two Phases of the Human Journey](#).

- 1. You will continue to experience your story from the perspective of a character within it.** This is a wonderful choice! It will give you all kinds of absolutely marvellous, exciting experiences. You will keep on experiencing victories and defeats, ups and downs, pain and joy. Even if you won't feel that way while it happens, looking back you will eventually greatly appreciate every single moment of your life story. Sooner or later you will realize that despite of what you felt while you went through your challenges, you wouldn't want it any different.
- 2. You will experience the story at two levels at the same time: As the hero within it and God the Creator.** This is a wonderful choice! You will awaken within the story, like in lucid dreaming. Challenges will feel the same way they feel in an amusement park. Thrilling, not dangerous. You will be able to play in any way you want. You will be free. You will greatly appreciate and enjoy every moment exactly as is, while it is unfolding.

**These two options are equally fantastic, equally amazing, equally valuable!**

**Where do you go? Which one do you choose?**

Here's the good news and the bad news: **It's not really up to you.** It depends on your story. It's entirely up to the Divine Storyteller.

So what does it mean in practical terms? What are you supposed to do then? Just sit there and wait for the story to unfold and the choice to be made for you somehow?

Yes and no. There's no need to "just sit there". **Be yourself! Live your life day by day, as you do already. Let it unfold in any way it unfolds. Play your role in any way you feel like playing it. And do whatever you feel like doing at any particular moment.**

Your story has many wonderful gifts for you to enjoy, including clues and tools and **maps to special places further down the road** that you can take advantage of. In a moment I am going to show you a few such maps.

All of them are great. So it's not a choice between a good map and a bad map. Rather, see how you feel about each of them. **Your feeling is your compass!**

Do you feel like exploring them or not? letting any of them go or taking some of them to your heart? **Follow your feeling!**

**Whatever you choose becomes part of your story and unfolds perfectly from there. You can't go wrong.**
